At 41+ weeks patients are offered a vaginal examination to sweep the membranes. This may be enough to begin labour, without the need to be induced. An appointment will be made to attend the Delivery Suite of patients choice 12 days after due date.

# Postnatal care

The day after you come home with your baby a midwife will visit you between 8am-4.30pm at home. If nobody arrives by 4.30pm please telephone 0118 322 7319 to let us know.

We cannot offer a timed visit for home appointments. We run a Mon-Fri Postnatal clinic at WBCH and can give you a set appointment then. The clinic is held in the 'children's department'. Please remember to bring your postnatal notes and red book with you to all appointments. To book an appointment at the clinic please telephone 01635 273387 between 8.30-9.30am.

Women will be seen when they request a visit, or at least: Day 1 at home Day 3-4 for baby weight Day 5-6 for Neonatal blood spot From Day 10 for discharge at WBCH, at Strawberry Hill Medical Centre, or at home.

Visits however are flexible, if you require more support we will ensure you get it. Some visits may be conducted by our Maternity Care Assistants who are trained to a high standard with breast feeding and support issues.
